DRIVING QUESTION

"If a young man grows up without a male role model in his life, who is he going to look up to?"

OUR ANSWER

A mentoring relationship between a Godly man and a boy with an absent-father.

WHO CAN BE A MENTOR?

· MEN WHO:

- Have time to invest into mentoring
- Have a personal and intimate relationship with Jesus Christ
- Are in active membership at a local church
- If married, have the blessing of their wife
- At a minimum, the ability to fulfill at one year commitment

MENTOR COMMITMENT

- See your Forerunner at the minimum, once every two weeks.
 We prefer once a week.
- Contact him via text or a phone call once a week.
- Make every effort to come to our Forerunner events.
- Make every effort to come to our Forerunner Trainings

MENTOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Show up
- Speak truth
- Love God

MENTORS SHOW UP

WE ASK THAT THE MENTOR SHOW UP ON A CONSISTENT BASIS TO SEE THEIR FORERUNNER. WE BELIEVE THIS IS THE MOST IMPORTANT PART OF BEING A MENTOR

 This includes coming to FMP events, school lunches, our after-school program, and initiating with the Forerunner outside of our programs.

MENTORS SPEAK TRUTH

WE ASK THAT OUR MENTORS BE THE MOST ENCOURAGING PERSON IN THE LIFE OF THEIR FORERUNNER. WHEN OUR FORERUNNER SEES THEIR MENTOR COMING, WE WANT THEM TO KNOW THAT INTERACTION IS GOING TO MAKE THEIR DAY BETTER.

- We ask that if our Forerunner is doing 99 things wrong and 1 thing right, you
 focus on that 1 thing.
- Focus on who he is, not what he is doing. Ask the Lord to change your heart so you see the Forerunner as the Lord sees them.

MENTORS LOVE GOD

- OUR EXPERIENCES TELL US THAT THAT DOESN'T WORK OUT TOO WELL. ACTIONS SPEAK LOUDER THAN WORDS. HE IS GOING TO LEARN HOW TO BECOME A GODLY MAN BY WATCHING YOU BE A GODLY MAN.
- IF WE LEAD BY EXAMPLE. OUR PROGRAM WILL:
 - Teach them the word of God
 - Teach them how to excel academically
 - Teach them how to build strong Godly character
 - Teach them how to deal with their emotions and how they respond to difficult situations

- We get the kids from their classrooms around 2:50pm.
- Their mom picks their kids up at 6:00pm.

WHAT DOES A NORMAL DAY LOOK LIKE?

WE SPEND THREE HOURS A DAY WITH OUR STUDENTS MONDAY THROUGH THURSDAY AFTERNOONS.

- Our basic model is:
 - An hour of fun and snack
 - We do this to build relational capital and to help our kids exercise/get rid of their energy
 - 30 minutes of reading through the bible
 - We use the bible to expose our kids to reading
 - 90 minutes of activities to develop literacy
 - We use fun and interactive games to teach reading and phonic skils through iStation and LLI curriculum

- Providing Get-a-way Days every quarter to serve our single mothers
